**I. Call to Order / Introductions**

Chair Solomon called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m. Chair Solomon asked those present to introduce themselves which they then did.

**II. Public Comment**

There was no public comment.

**III. December 7, 2017 Minutes**

Mr. Solomon asked for any additions, corrections, or deletions to the December 7, 2017 minutes.

**ACTION:** Mr. Bozievich moved, seconded by Mr. Trapp, to approve the December 7, 2017 minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

**IV. Intra-System Communication**

Youth Services Division

Ms. Frener reported that Youth Services was partnering with Parole & Probation (P&P) for training purposes. She also reported that her office had been working with the Lane County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) regarding the youths that occupy the "gray area" around 18 years old.

Lane County Circuit Court

Ms. Rambo said that Judge Vogt was assigning cases out prior to 35-day call in the mornings, so there would no longer be a mass call in courtroom 201. She offered that the judicial budget was continuing to face reductions; she said that in Lane County, that meant a \$1.6 million dollar reduction in court staffing.

District Attorney

Ms. Perlow announced that the Chief Deputy DA position had been eliminated and that Erik Hasselman would be joining the Major Crimes Team. She also stated that her and her staff were planning to meet soon to discuss where the duties of the Chief Deputy would land.

Oregon State Police

Mr. Schleicher reported that the four recruits that had entered field training for Springfield Area Command had all advanced, and would be beginning solo patrols immediately—three new troopers in the Springfield area, and one in Florence. He added there had been a change in Oregon State Police (OSP) Criminal Division Sergeant.

### Health & Human Services - Mental Health

Ms. Nichols said the Mental Health Workgroup had met that morning, where the body reviewed its Workplan from last year, and prioritized this year's goals.

### Reentry Services - PSCC Chair

Chair Solomon reported that he had recently met with the Executive Director of the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) to talk about Sponsors' Pay for Success Project. He said they discussed the topic of a Clackamas County DA suing the State around the implementation of State House Bill 3078. He shared that Sponsors had been looking at data surrounding the Pay for Success Project with an assist from the CJC. CJC ran data on a cohort of people housed at Sponsors 2012-2015 and found a 15% recidivism rate for that group compared to 32% for the county as a whole for the same period.

### Lane County Sheriff

Vice Chair Trapp announced the termination of the Jail Bed Contract between LCSO and the US Marshals Service. He said the termination of the contract would add back in 50 jail beds for local use.

### Lane County Board of Commissioners

Mr. Bozievich reported that he was elected Chair of the Lane County Board of Commissioners for 2018, which would put him in an advocacy position for the County's 10-Year-Public Safety Plan. He said Lane County is not anticipating any major budget reductions for the upcoming fiscal year at this point.

Ms. Gaffney entered the meeting at 3:25 p.m.

### Victim Services

Ms. Stewart reported that Kids' FIRST was piloting expanding mental health services for the adult caregivers of the children who have disclosed sexual abuse. She said Siuslaw Outreach Services was working with students at Siuslaw High School to start a support group for teens who are victims of domestic violence. She said Sexual Assault Support Services reports 1,600 calls for service for 2017 with 248 of those in person. Ms. Stewart concluded by saying that preliminary reports from Womenspace showed a 20% increase in survivors seeking services.

### Lane County Parole & Probation

Mr. Dumire announced that PP had been using the Police Training Officer (PTO) model out of Reno, Nevada for the past two years. He said recently PP had the opportunity to share the PTO training with Clackamas, Douglas, Linn, and Yamhill counties. Finally, Mr. Dumire announced the hire of three new officers.

### Lane County Administration

Mr. Rikhoff announced the County was at work on its Strategic Plan, and soon a survey would be released to the public to get their feedback on the County's direction.

### Lane County Public Defender

Mr. Reinhard reported that his office had hired two new attorneys. He said his office was pursuing a grant that would free up some Measure 98 dollars for the dedication of one or two attorneys who would deal solely with Veteran's issues.

### City of Oakridge

Mr. Gomez thanked LCSO, OSP, and the DA's Office for their assistance with a homicide case in Oakridge. He said the City of Oakridge had recently released a survey to citizens of Oakridge, Westfir, and outlying areas of eastern Lane County to gauge public opinion about putting in a community center or an Amtrak station. Emerald Broadband is beginning installation this month. The City Council is

considering an ordinance to allow Class IV ATVs with 2 seats and rollbars on roadways when they come from the National Forest for fuel and food. He also reported the installation of a flashing crosswalk in Oakridge which was badly needed.

#### Health & Human Services - Public Health

Ms. Gaffney said she hoped to provide an update on the FUSE Program at the March PSCC meeting. She stated her office was in the process of financing the FUSE Project, and that one of HHS's goals, was to find at least \$2 million in gap funding from the healthcare community. Ms. Gaffney reported that the Trillium Board had committed to a \$500,000 contribution.

### **V. Committee Reports**

#### **A. Budget Committee**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC an update from the Budget Committee. She announced that the Community Corrections Act (CCA) Plan had made it through the County process.

### **VI. DUII Resources and Partnerships**

Mr. Estes offered the PSCC a report on DUII resources and partnerships.

Vice Chair Trapp asked if the Impaired Driving Program (IDP) funded full-time employee positions yet, or if it was still limited only to overtime.

Mr. Estes replied that it depended on the circumstance, although currently, it was mostly overtime only for enforcement.

Mr. Dumire asked if the IDP was offering any kind of treatment services.

Mr. Estes answered they were not at this time.

Mr. Reinhard asked, if the IDP was not funding treatment, were they funding any assessments.

Mr. Estes responded that through the Oregon Health Authority's (OHA) Impaired Driver Fund, an assessment could be covered financially.

Mr. Estes reported he anticipates a funding decision in 2-3 weeks regarding a DUII Investigator for the DA's Office.

### **VII. Lane County Public Safety Plan**

Chair Solomon and Vice Chair Trapp offered the PSCC a report and PowerPoint presentation on the Lane County Public Safety Plan. They suggested the PSCC take an active role in managing and monitoring progress on this plan, reviewing it annually.

Mr. Bozievich expressed concern at the Public Safety Plan's execution; he thought there was a scarcity of resources. He offered that adding Public Safety Districts (PSD) to the Eugene-Springfield Metro Plan might be necessary for long-term local funding of the County's 10-Year Public Safety Plan.

Ms. Perlow left the meeting at 4:01 p.m.

Mr. Reinhard left the meeting at 4:12 p.m.

**VIII. PSCC Orientation**

Chair Solomon said that since most of the newest members of the PSCC were not in attendance, he would survey interest in a PSCC orientation by email.

**IX. Justice Reinvestment Grant Program Semi-Annual Report**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC a semi-annual report on the Justice Reinvestment Grant Program (JRGP).

**X. Bylaws Revisions**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC an overview and handout on recommended bylaws revisions. She added that the revisions were mostly housekeeping.

**ACTION:** Ms. Gaffney moved, seconded by Mr. Dumire, to accept the revisions to the bylaws and recommend them to the Board of County Commissioners for action. The motion passed unanimously.

**XI. Grant Update**

**A. Grant Application Status**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC a grant application status update.

**B. NIC Director's Award Application: Norval Morris Program Award for Corrections Innovation**

Chair Solomon suggested the PSCC move to nominate the Lane County Jail for this award.

**ACTION:** Mr. Bozievich moved, seconded by Mr. Dumire, to nominate the Lane County Jail for the Norval Morris Program Award for Corrections Innovation. The motion passed unanimously.

**XII. 2018-2020 Leadership Elections**

**A. Chair Election**

**ACTION:** Mr. Dumire moved, seconded by Mr. Gomez, to elect Paul Solomon as the PSCC Chair. The motion passed unanimously.

**B. Vice Chair Election**

**ACTION:** Ms. Gaffney moved, seconded by Mr. Bozievich, to elect Sheriff Byron Trapp as Vice Chair of the PSCC. The motion passed unanimously.
