**I. Call to Order / Introductions**

Chair Solomon called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m. Chair Solomon asked those present to introduce themselves which they then did.

**II. Public Comment**

There was no public comment.

**III. January 18, 2018 Minutes**

Mr. Solomon asked for any additions, corrections, or deletions to the January 18, 2018 minutes.

**ACTION:** Ms. Gaffney moved, seconded by Ms. Perlow, to approve the January 18, 2018 minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

**IV. Intra-System Communication**

Lane County District Attorney

Ms. Perlow announced that her office had tentative approval from the Oregon Department of Transportation for a grant which would fund a DUI Investigator in the DA's office.

Oregon State Police

Mr. Schleicher announced that OSP had promoted Senior Trooper Eli Chambers to the Oakridge Patrol Sergeant position. He said that all of his sergeant positions were now full.

Oregon Youth Authority

Mr. Jones said that he had been selected for Oregon Leadership, and there may be an occasional conflict with the PSCC meetings. He announced that OYA Youth Services had a new Director, Joe O'Leary. He also said his office was currently working on parole revocations

County Administrator

Mr. Rikhoff offered that the County would be applying for quiet title of the land swap with the City of Eugene, so the County could secure the former City Hall site to begin construction of the new County Courthouse.

Parole and Probation

Mr. Dumire said that his office was working closely with Lane County Behavioral Health (LCBH) to

integrate Parole and Probation and treatment services onsite at LCBH. He added that the Oregon Association of Community Corrections Directors (OACCD) had developed a statewide charter because of the efforts of his office and LCBH

#### Lane County Board of Commissioners

Mr. Bozievich said the County was on the verge of approving a Strategic Plan, and he asked the PSCC Members to take a look at it. He said he attended a recent conversation in the Mohawk/Marcola area on traffic safety.

#### Lane County Sheriff

Vice Chair Trapp announced his office had recently concluded meetings with all of Lane County Sheriff's municipal partners. He offered that as a result of those conversations, there was a policy change which would allow those in the jail on municipal charges only to be released as capacity based releases before Circuit Court offenders.

Mayor Vinis entered the meeting at 3:18 p.m.

#### Reentry Services - PSCC Chair

Chair Solomon announced that Sponsors Tiny House Project was expected to break ground in late summer. He also mentioned Sponsors bi-annual benefit and awards ceremony, at which Captain Dan Buckwald would be recognized. Chair Solomon also announced that the Governor's Reentry Council was launching a Second Chance Tour on April 10, 2017, followed by regional kickoffs.

#### Victim Services

Ms. Sowards read a prepared report by Sarah Stewart of Victim Services who had a conflict for the PSCC meeting.

#### Lane County Circuit Court

Ms. Vogt reported they have had an unprecedented number of jurors during the month of March. She also reported that she had been appointed to the Prison Forecast Advisory Committee and the Public Safety Taskforce.

#### Health & Human Services - Mental Health

Ms. Nichols said the Behavioral Health & Criminal Justice Workgroup had met that morning, and had identified a gap in communication around when offenders have court dates. She announced that her office was continuing to make great strides in working with the Aid & Assist population. She concluded that LCBH positions were fully staffed in the jail.

#### Health & Human Services - Public Health

Ms. Gaffney described what Project 250 was. She added that a huge focus for Public Health of late has been the Adolescent Suicide Roster. Ms. Gaffney announced that many partners were working to pull together an application for a HUD Youth Homelessness Demonstration Grant.

#### Youth Services Division

Ms. Frener said Youth Services and the Sheriff's Office had developed an MOU regarding where to lode youth according to charge. She reported her office was starting a Minor in Possession (MIP) class in Florence and that there was an open Supervisor position at the Phoenix Residential Treatment Center.

#### Citizen Member

Mr. English said there was more interest now in the public about what is going on in criminal justice. He reported that recently, through a grant from the Oregon Episcopalian Diocese, a convocation was held,

and there were so many people attending the convocation, they had to turn people away.

Lane County Public Defender

Mr. Homan announced his office was up to full staff as far as lawyers were concerned. He added that the Public Defender's office had recently applied for a grant that would help Veterans specifically.

Eugene Mayor

Ms. Vinis announced that she and Councilor Evans had switched roles, and she was happy to be sitting on the PSCC. The Council has identified three areas of focus for this year: Homelessness, Housing, and Public Safety.

**V. Committee Reports**

**A. Budget Committee**

There was no report from the Budget Committee. The Committee will reconvene in May.

**B. Behavioral Health & Criminal Justice Workgroup**

There was no report from the Behavioral Health & Criminal Justice Workgroup.

**C. Juvenile Committee Report**

Ms. Frener offered the PSCC a Juvenile Committee Report

**D. Reentry Task Force Report**

Chair Solomon updated the PSCC on the HUD Pay for Success program. He said they were going to try and launch the program in September of this year.

**E. Workplan Workgroup**

There was no report from the Workplan Workgroup.

**VI. DUII Resources and Partnerships Report**

Ms. Perlow had given this report previously, during Intra-System Communication.

**VII. Justice Reinvestment Grant Program Formula and Supplemental Semi-Annual Reports**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC a report on the Justice Reinvestment Grants' reports.

**VIII. FUSE Report**

Ms. Bautista and Ms. Gaffney offered the PSCC a report and Power Point Presentation on the FUSE project.

Vice Chair Trapp posited that if his office had the names in a jail lodging history, it would provide even more savings.

Chair Solomon asked at what point the FUSE program would generate cost savings at the local level.

Vice Chair Trapp said there was probably a way to quantify the actual daily rate savings.

Chair Solomon wondered if booking charges would be quantified as well.

Vice Chair Trapp said he believed the daily rate included all the costs, including booking charges.

Ms. Bautista offered that the housing part of the FUSE program had presented the most challenges for the Program.

Chair Solomon posited that FUSE engagement numbers could be brought up as well.

Ms. Bautista agreed.

Mr. Rikhoff said that he would also like to see the daily rate numbers that Sheriff Trapp had mentioned.

Mr. Homan wondered if there was a figure representing the number of potential frequent users locally.

Ms. Bautista said that from the data currently available, it was close to 300 people.

## **IX. PSCC Membership Recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners**

### **A. Lay Citizen Position**

Chair Solomon announced that the PSCC has had a number of unfilled Lay Citizen positions. He cited the possibility of reducing the number of lay members from seven to two.

Mr. English said he would be in favor of reducing the number of lay members, but perhaps not so drastically.

Mr. Bozievich suggested that the process of having Commissioners recruit lay members would be daunting for the Commissioners, who already have plenty to do.

Ms. Gaffney wondered how much of this issue was a recruitment problem, and how much of it was due to the PSCC having so many positions. She wondered if a compromise of three or four lay members instead of two, would be an appropriate compromise.

Chair Solomon suggested this issue be brought back to the Executive Team (previously Agenda Setting Committee) with interested members Tom English, Jason Jones, and Greg Rikhoff invited to that meeting to develop a recommendation to bring to the May PSCC meeting.

Ms. Vogt posited that it should not be less than two lay members.

Chair Solomon said a little extra time would be added to the next Executive Team to address the issue.

### **B. Springfield Police Chief Position**

**ACTION:** Vice Chair Trapp moved, seconded by Ms. Vogt, to recommend the Board of County Commissioners create a position on the PSCC for the Springfield Police Chief. The motion passed unanimously.

## **X. Grant Update**

Ms. Sowards offered the PSCC a grant application status update.

Mr. Cuyler offered the PSCC a Legislative Update
